Dear Friends,

February is the month of Super Bowl, Abraham Lincoln's (12th, 1809) and George Washington's (22nd, 1732) birthdays, Valentine's Day (14th), and one more:

Ash Wednesday, this year

also on February 14. That last important day starts the Christian season of Lent, which comes from a word meaning "to lengthen," which connects with the season of spring. I invite us to reflect on what God might want us to learn and to receive from Him this month and during the season of Lent; Lent continues until Easter, which falls this year on April 1, yes, April Fool's Day.

For a moment I want to go back to a word I used in the last paragraph: REFLECT! Of the various definitions to be found, I want to point us to one in particular - "to think, ponder or meditate." That is the polar opposite of being constantly distracted, immediately attending to the latest idea or product of our culture, the culture of acquisition and selfishness in which we find ourselves. Lent provides us an opportunity to "stop and smell the roses." Because He has more for us to receive, this spring, as followers of the Way (remember, Jesus said "I am the way, truth and light"), we will again review Jesus' life as He gradually and purposefully walks toward Jerusalem where He willingly will give up His earthly life to make a way for us to have a heavenly one.

During the Lenten season, I will preach a series of messages about Jesus' experiences. To the point, I want us to glimpse where Jesus, all the while teaching, feeding, healing, and entralling the people, sticks up for the underdog, the one that the people have ignored or condemned. Jesus' life is not only fascinating and riveting, but a quick review of his encounters with Zacchaeus and his stories

about good Samaritans, feuding brothers, and others will make Easter a richer and more holy day for us all.

Four more comments: first, on February 4 and 11, I will conclude a series that was earlier entitled, "Jesus and Harvey Weinstein," about a Christian response to the challenges of sexual misconduct and abuse today.

Second: Beginning on Monday, February 5, I hope (at this writing my enrollment seems likely but not yet achieved) to be taking an online class from United Seminary in Dayton, Ohio, on United Methodist Doctrine. It's possible I might be finished by Easter. We'll see.

Third: I have been deeply disturbed by the recent suicide of Tyler Hilinski, backup WSU quarterback. His funeral will be February 3 in Laverne, CA. What a loss! He is one of many this year who have left us so tragically. Pray for his family and for us as we seek to help others choose life.

Fourth: This month I begin my seventh year as your pastor. What a privilege I have had to share life with you these past six years! We have more growing to do. May we REFLECT Jesus' as we live each day.

FINANCE COMMITTEE

Did you know that for KFUMC, 68% of the total General Fund budget is for payroll-related expenses? To keep our excellent staff somewhat on par with the cost of living increases, an allowance of 2% has been budgeted for staff payroll increases for 2018. This percentage is the equivalent of the increase in 2018 Social Security benefits. For the continuation of services as we know them, we, as a congregation, need to recognize the increased costs associated with staff, and in particular, the cost of medical insurance. Therefore, as you evaluate your own personal budgets for 2018, please consider increasing your church contributions to help cover the normal increases of cost to run the church.

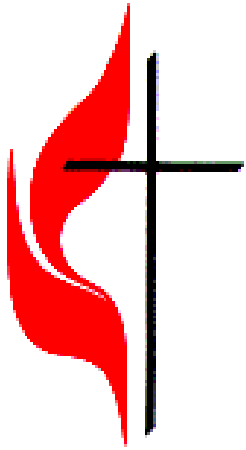
