Please remember that we will be following the rules of the park and be sharing space with our church family. Several families may be sharing a site; for example an RV belonging to one family and a tent belonging to another family may be sharing the same site number, as long as they don't exceed the maximum number of 8 total people per site. You must let the church know exact number of people in your party and if that changes.

Each site has standard electric \* Electrical hook up 50 amp

Check in after 2:00 pm on Friday and check out by Noon on Sunday

Pets allowed: domestic on a leash

Maximum number vehicles per site is 3; however, we will work that out as a group and there is extra parking.

A Picnic table per site is provided, but feel free to bring your own.

No water on each site; however, water spigots are plentiful and close. RVs should arrive prefilled.

Close to restrooms and shower house.

There is a playground, beach and swimming, hiking and fishing...and boating if you have one!

**You and your family will be assigned a site number prior to the weekend camp out so that you will know where to set up!**

The church will be hosting several events during the camp out weekend at the park that we will make known closer to the event. Those events will also be open to church family who are not able to camp but want to come out and fellowship during the weekend.

## **Overview**

Hood Park is located on Lake Wallula in eastern Washington. The lake is formed by McNary Lock and Dam on the Mid-Columbia River. Lewis and Clark camped two miles downstream at the confluence of the Snake and Columbia Rivers, which is now the location of Sacajawea State Park. Visitors enjoy camping, fishing, boating, hiking, picnicking, and swimming.

**Recreation:** The lake provides great boating and swimming opportunities, and a boat ramp is provided for guests. Fishing is also a popular pastime, and anglers will find excellent salmon and steelhead fishing on the lake.

**Facilities:** Hood Park offers 67 family sites and one day-use group picnic shelter, all with electric hookups.

## Know Before You Go

- Sites do not have water hookup; you can fill tanks at dump station
- Only standalone hammocks allowed
- Alcoholic beverages prohibited by state law
- Park gate closed from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m.
- Motorized/battery operated scooters and toy cars prohibited
- Pets must always be restrained
- Campground check-in time is after 2 p.m. (no exceptions)
- All campers must stop and check-in at gate house before proceeding into the campground

**Getting There:** From Pasco, Washington, take Highway 12 east. After crossing the Snake River Bridge, take the next exit and continue to State Route 124. The park entrance is on the left just after the roundabout.
