## Hi friends,

Before I remind you of a few important things happening this week at church, I wanted to address some questions that I, and other pastors in the community and state-wide, have been fielding. The questions revolve around the election that we are now just 11 days away from. Every election year around this time, will be people who implicitly or explicitly tell people, "the church is making its members vote for 'such and such a candidate'". In years past we have heard stories of random phone solicitors calling and saying they represent a candidate and that your church is telling you to vote for this candidate. If you receive such a call, or hear these kinds of messages, I want you all to know that they are not true. There are some congregations that align themselves with certain political parties or stances, but Kennewick First United Methodist is **NOT** one of them. Since its beginning, Kennewick First has had a membership that reflects various political parties, and our church has always encouraged its members to vote their conscience. The same holds true in this election. Our congregation, and the United Methodist Church throughout the United States, reflects the diverse political understandings of the nation. As your pastor, I reiterate that advise... please make sure you submit your ballot and vote within the next 11 days! AND as your Pastor, I want to encourage you to vote your conscience. I hope that what you believe to be true about God, about your relationship with God and your relationship with others, informs the vote that you cast.

There are two other things I want you to be aware of on this topic. When someone says "The United Methodist Church says...", that statement is not entirely correct, unless the General Conference of the UMC (which happens every 4 years... usually) has voted and agreed on a statement, we do not speak as a single voice on many topics. I will often hear in news reports that the "UMC believes...", but in reality, they are reporting on an influential pastor's belief, or a church near Washington DC, or a large church with certain political clout. But if you hear "the UMC endorses this candidate" or "The UMC has told its members to vote for...", it is simply not true.

The last thing I will say about this topic is: by federal law, as a non-profit organization we are not allowed to endorse or require our membership to vote in elections in a prescribed way. So, as your Pastor, I hope you hear my words when I encourage you to exercise your right to vote. It is something that should not be taken for granted, and a right that is the envy of most of the world! And I hope that your faith informs the ballot you cast before the November 3rd election.

**THIS SUNDAY, OCTOBER 25<sup>TH</sup>, WE WILL HAVE ANOTHER DRIVE IN WORSHIP SERVICE**. Because the weather has become a bit cooler, we will not be doing the outdoor seating area. So, there will only be reserved car parking spots. We have 35 parking spots available for you and your household to participate inside your car. Because of the way we are reserving spots by carload, when you register your spot, "**type 1**" when asked "How many will be attending?"
