Hi Friends,

Beyond the general announcements of things that are happening in the upcoming week, I wanted to take an opportunity to give you an update on where we are, and what we are working on, in terms of our response to the Covid-19 pandemic and re-opening our facilities. As a background, early in the pandemic, I gathered individuals who are involved in various ministries like worship, facilities, staffing, finance, our leadership council, community ministries and others who have expertise in emergency management, to form an "Emergency Planning Team" (EPT). That group worked diligently to formulate our local church plan towards reopening. As you know, our challenge has been living in the areas in which our local church plan meshes with the plan given us by the PNW Annual Conference and the Washington State plans.

When we originally formulated our plans, information was scarce and ever evolving. Recognizing that reality, we made a commitment to revisit the plan as new information and "best practices" emerged. This week our EPT met and put together a proposal to begin limited re-openings specifically in worship to submit to the Bishop's office. The proposal uses the data source of <u>www.CovidActNow.org</u> which is the agreed upon data source for our churches, so that we are all using the same data in our planning. Our prayer is that this begins the process for us to begin having in-person worship services in a limited way in the months ahead. Because this is exactly that... a process, I do not want to propose dates or numbers or specifics because as we have found in the past, things change rapidly, but I hope to be able to give you some new information in the upcoming weeks on this front.

Several months ago, we decided that we were going to continue to operate with the systems and protocols we have in place until **at least** Easter, as a way of curbing the frustration of planning and always being in a "maybe in three weeks..." or "maybe in a month..." mindset that was taking a toll on the moral and energy of us all. With that commitment we will continue in our present protocols through Easter Sunday ... at Least... with hopes that we can begin the process of re-opening in limited ways in the month ahead. To that end, our Easter celebration will be some kind of limited in person gathering, either using our "drive-in" church model and its approved protocols on our own property, or at another outdoor venue. Information about that will be coming in in next week's email.

That is where we are... As your pastor, I have always wanted to be as open and transparent with you all regarding my own faith, frustrations, and joys because we are all disciples making our way to be more like Jesus. This week was especially frustrating for me because, as you all remember, it was the third week of Lent in 2020 that we had to start doing our worship services virtually. This week is again the third week of Lent and we are still worshipping together via that medium. Things that I could do "in my sleep" as a pastor with 25 years of experience, have become long, difficult, time consuming and require vast amounts of energy. I know the novelty of online worship; remote Bible studies and gatherings is wearing off for all of us and we are

tired. **BUT** (I have a dear friend who says, "Jesus always has a big but..."). I have been encouraged as well, from the notes and cards you have sent me and our staff encouraging us (THANK YOU!). I have been moved to tears at emails I've received from people in remote places who have tuned in to our online worship and rediscovered a sense of worship and community as strange and different looking as it is. I, like most of us, have been reminded that church is more about this community that works to usher in the Kingdom of God beyond limits of buildings and programs. So, although I am tired, I am full of hope that the God who loves us has not forsaken us. Like so many examples in scripture and history, the people of God continue to be people of life, grace and hope even in hardship. I'm convinced that God is with us, even as we are weary. Thank you for your support and commitment to be people that live and share the hope that only comes through Jesus!
