As a country, we were based on some principles that were new and revolutionary for the day. That individuals have rights that were given to us by God. Things like the right to our own life, the right to liberty and living as you like, as long as it does not harm others, and the right to pursue happiness. Ironically, it is not our independence, but the strength of our community that insures those God given rights. As many have said when justice is delayed for one justice, is in fact denied and that injustice anywhere is a threat to justice everywhere. So as this Independence Day arrives, I hope you can celebrate the country we are a part of and the principles that we stand for... that I believe are given to us by God. My prayer for our nation is that we will always continue to confess our short comings, and work as a community to insure that experiencing those God given rights is a reality for all people.

Protocol updates

Our re-opening plan has been modified to incorporate the State recommendations and CDC advise. So as of June 30th, we have updated our mask and spacing protocols to match the state's "Washington Ready" proclamation. That means that the face covering at worship is no longer a requirement and that social distancing is no longer in place. We will also be updating our occupancy limits from 50% to 100%... until we bump into the 10,000 in attendance qualifier ©. Although we are making these updates, we are well aware that the threat of Covid-19 and its variants are a huge concern for the health of many of us, and we want to do our best to make sure we do not contribute to any new outbreaks. We will continue to have sanitizing stations available, encourage people to receive vaccinations, we will ask you to continue to sign in as you enter worship in case, we need to get in touch with you with news about exposure or health concerns, and we will be holding off on receiving communion until the 1st Sunday of August when we can implement some safe practices in that ritual. At this point, the CDC notes that singing together in indoor spaces is still among the activities with the highest likelihood of spreading the virus, so we will continue to hum along with our worship team for the time being.
