Hi friends!

I want to take a moment and send you thanks on behalf of my family and myself. The sudden death of my brother-in-law due to the Covid-19 infection has been heartbreaking for our family. I am often in tears as I return from the mailbox with stacks of envelopes from you all offering your sympathy and prayers. I admit that we have not read most of them just because we are still not quite in the place to sit with them right now but know that we are eternally grateful for them! I am not the only one who has been on the receiving end of your compassion and care. In just the past couple of weeks many in our staff have experienced the death of people close to us we love. Cynthia Bement is grieving the loss of her aunt who passed away quickly after a cancer diagnosis. Rachel Loomis received news that a dear friend passed away during childbirth of her first child. It has been a season of loss for so many of us. Some of us grieve the loss of loved ones who have died, some of us are deeply affected by the loss of a sense of "normal life" in the past year and a half. For many of us, we are finally starting to feel some sense of relief, only to have infection numbers spike and a new aggressive variant rear its head. Some of us feel as though we are experiencing something like Post Traumatic Stress Disorder as a result of the 19 months we have shared together.

I bring this all up for a couple of reasons 1) To tell you thank you for the way you have cared for one another. I communicate with many other pastors and other congregations on a regular basis and many, when under the kind of stress, we have experienced, do not treat each other well. I am so grateful that Kennewick First has shown love and care to one another in this season. 2) To remind us that in in this community of faith we get to experience the Love of God through our relationships in this church, AND we have the privilege of extending that same love, compassion to each

other, and to the world when we commit to loving God with all we are and loving our neighbors. Thank you for being that church!

Finally, I want to encourage all of us to evaluate our actions and risks in light of the Delta Variant that is sweeping through our community. We will continue to gather together for worship services, asking that all of us participate in the compassionate inconvenience of wearing masks, regardless of our vaccination status. We are asking that you make use of the sanitizing stations available as you enter, and that we don't linger in the building after the service. If you have been exposed to someone who has been ill or are showing symptoms of illness please stay home and take care of yourself. Even with those protocols in place and following the CDC and State guidelines for religious gatherings, many of us are not comfortable gathering in groups. Please know that you have our support if you decide in person worship is not the best choice for you! Knowing that is the case for many of us, we have made a commitment to make sure that we live stream our Worship services every Sunday so that you can continue to be part of the worshipping life of Kennewick First even remotely.
