I will not fear, for You are ever with me, and You will never leave me to face my perils alone. Amen.

Adult Study on Sunday Mornings Starting September 12

Jim Deatherage and Bob Kelly (AKA JimBob) will offer a study of the book "12 Steps for the Recovering Pharisee" (like me) by John Fisher (2000). It is 12 chapters, so a 12-week course once started. Probably 13 with a first week of orientation and getting books out.

Our course 'plan' revolves around a simple process. Reading the book together will provide **information.** The class discussion and prayerful introspection of this information will produce **revelation**. These two elements will then produce **transformation**...our lives changed to embrace the Gospel: the good news for sinners.

The class will start at 9 AM and last 45 minutes. We anticipate being in the library, but total enrollees will dictate our exact location. The cost of the book is \$13.35, but don't let the cost keep you away. The description below will provide an overview of the book's focus.

Fisher talks about his interest in borrowing the recovery model as a way of unmasking and potentially freeing us from the intoxication of spiritual pride and prejudice that continually lures believers away from grace, gratitude, and life astonishment that the Spirit of God desires for us. He also points out that Jesus defined the truth in such a way as to leave no one righteous – not one. We cannot be made right before God by being "better" than anyone else. By recognizing and laying aside the Pharisee in all of us, we can embrace the grace, gratitude, and joy of the spirit-filled life.
