Many quilts and blankets have been donated this year – thanks to those dedicated quilters and blanket makers for their hard work. We give many blankets out and we place one in each bedroll as the sleeping bags are very light weight. Many thanks to all of the folks who provide the blankets, pick up the Panera donations, make the bedrolls, collect the personal care items – the list is exhaustive for all of the behind-the-scene folks making the lives of those who come to Soul Soup a little richer.

What's in a Name

The theme and curriculum that our PNW Conference is using for Summer Camp this year is called "What's in a

Name." The focus is on naming and claiming who God created us to be.

Names have great power. Some hold special meanings and some come with expectations. In a lifetime, we may give new meaning to our name or take a new name. Along the journey, we discover who we are and how God equips us to care for others. Campers are invited to use the sacred ground of camp to reflect on who they are as an individual and how they are connected to others. As we explore, we will be reminded that God knows us beyond any name we might be called and invites us into relationship.

As I write this, I am preparing to lead Primary campers (children entering 1st-3rd grade) June 26-29 at Twinlow Camp in the role of Camp Pastor. I've been going through the stories and scriptures that share how much God loves them and that He knows them by name! It will be exciting to teach these little ones about God calling out to Moses through a non-consuming burning bush...yes, God knew Moses' name and his past, yet called him into a key leadership role! We will talk about Jesus changing Simon's name to Peter ("Rock") and the importance of the name change. Other great namings we will get to explore are Elizabeth naming John and, of course, Mary naming Jesus! There are many different names for God found in the scriptures and it will be fun to dive into them. Of course, Primary campers are at a foundational level, so we keep the theology simple. The Primary campers will likely have more to say about getting "called names" than

questioning why Jesus would change someone's name, or they may wonder if Jesus will change their own name! Being around Primary campers reminds me that it's ok to ask questions, because they typically have plenty . . . about everything!

For many of these children it will be their first time away from home, taking a swim test, trying new food, walking outside to another building to use the restroom, making new friends, and hearing about the love of Jesus. If the campers leave Twinlow knowing that they are known, beloved Children of God and that camp was a safe place to grow in life and faith, then we will have prevailed! The win is when we see them again the following summer, remember them, and call them by name!
