

#### Get up ... Flee ... Go!

The "flight to Egypt" is recounted in the Gospel of Matthew 2:13-15.

The scriptures share that "an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, 'Get up, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there until I tell you; for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy him." This was not the first time Joseph received a message from the Lord regarding the Messiah, but I'm sure that this particular news was simply terrifying to Joseph. There would have been no time for careful folding and packing, a garage sale, or a going away party with family and friends. This was a "run-for-your-life" survival moment! The message from God that the angel delivered required an immediate response. Jesus' two Daddy's were working together to keep Him safe . . . to save His life.

And both Mary and Joseph were obedient to the voice of God as the Lord directed their path toward safety. And they were safe.

As I read this story, I see many reasons to pause and ponder my faith in the new year.

- · Am I listening to the voice of God . . . do I quiet my soul enough to hear?
- · As I read the scriptures, do I listen for direction?
- · Am I obedient to the Lord?
- · What do I need to flee from that might bring me to a healthier place?
- · Why did God put breath in my lungs today?
- · When God calls me to go . . . how quickly do I respond?

There are many more questions that I can ask when I read this passage . . . these are

just the first that God placed on my heart. We often make New Year resolutions, but there is one we should make each day - that we would open our eyes and ask the Lord for direction for our lives . . . and then ask for the grace to follow that direction when it comes. Each day we are given life, life that belongs to the Lord. We all have unhealthy habits that we could flee from, or life-giving healthy disciplines we could run to . . . or both! Are there warnings God is giving to you that you need to heed? To whom might the Lord be directing you that you can help? How can you better listen to the still small voice of God? May we, like Joseph respond without hesitation to the direction we receive.

In this New Year, why not try a combination of Nike's old slogan, "Just Do It," with its new slogan of "Play New" - who knows, BIG things could happen between you and God for the transformation of the world!!
