As Timothy Keller writes in The Reason for God: "The Christian Gospel is that I am so flawed that Jesus had to die for me, yet I am so loved and valued that Jesus was glad to die for me. This leads to deep humility and deep confidence at the same time. It undermines both swaggering and sniveling. I cannot feel superior to anyone, and yet I have nothing to prove to anyone. I do not think more of myself nor less of myself. Instead, I think of myself less."





I was pretty sure that the reason I never won was that I didn't order anything! Still, I could picture the prize patrol folks standing at my door with the oversized million-dollar cardboard check in one hand and a bouquet of red roses in the other. Oh, the cool things one could do with their winnings!

Several weeks ago, while cleaning a youth storage area, I came across a big stack of index cards that were used in a team building "get to know you" exercise. Some cards helped us to know others by prompting us to share our favorite ice cream or TV show, or food. Other questions required a bit more thought:

- where do you feel closest to God?
- what is something you wish you could do? and...
- if you won the lottery, what is the first thing you would purchase?

The stack of cards had been filled out by both leaders and teens twenty years ago. I found mine and giggled at my responses because they remain true to this day! When I read the answer that I gave to the lottery question, I was humbled. I could not have imagined that my answer would become a reality . . . but it did! . . . but *not* through the lottery. My answer was that "I would buy the church a big bus, with a bathroom, air conditioning, and TVs with a VCR." The reason for the desire was the then-challenge of traveling with the youth in a caravan of 9 vehicles, 3 of them 15 passenger vans, with one typically pulling a trailer. Leaders were often driving their own vehicles, and our

group spent a lot of time separated, not together. I knew a bus would be so helpful, but, hey, I didn't even play the lottery!!

But God knew the desires and prayers of my heart and the concerns for the safety and closeness of our group. So with the help of some pretty amazing people, lots of fundraising, and a church that supports young people, the dream became a reality. With Jerry driving and me in the jump seat, we brought our "new-to-us" 47 passenger bus (with a bathroom, AC, and TV & DVD player) back from Seattle! She was always known as "the big bus," and she was loved.

God didn't need for me to win the Publishers Clearing House sweepstakes or the lottery in order to provide for our needs. Let us not forget that our God can do ANY-THING, nothing is too hard for the Lord! If God can resurrect Jesus Christ, and erase sin from us, then *of course* God could help us move people from point A to point B!
