You have not heard from me recently concerning the finances of our church. However, our church has entered a period where our member giving has not kept up with the programs that we offer. Our General Fund giving is \$64,000 lower than our budgeted amount through the

first three quarters of the year. Some of this is due to the negative impact of COVID on our attendance and on our reduced giving the past couple of years. In spite of this, we have maintained our strong programs for youth, Sunday school, community service, and worship. Unfortunately, we have had to access reserves to keep these programs operational.

I encourage you to prayerfully examine your personal giving to help us reach the giving levels that existed prior to COVID. We need your help. Remember that our operational expenses also suffer from the impacts of inflation. Thankfully, we have not had to use a pledge program for several years because the congregation has voluntarily recognized the need for financial support of the church programs.

While our church buildings are beautiful, they are 100 years old, requiring increases in maintenance and repair. In addition to the building maintenance, many of you listened to Bob Arnold's presentation about the sewer problem and necessary repair that will impact the northeast corner of the church. While addressing that imminent problem is most important and will be completed first, we will work in stages thereafter to improve the public appearance of what used to be the main entrance to the church. Because this will be a major project, we will be asking for your special support in this effort. More detailed cost information on this major project will be provided once we have secured bids from contractors.

We appreciate your attention to these important issues of our church.

Message from your Lay Leader

On Sunday, October 8, Cynthia spoke with our young disciples about regretting our actions and how God has a big eraser to erase our mistakes and make our sins go away. So, I started to pay attention to the occurrences in my life that I would have thought were coincidences. Boy, was I surprised! Things would occur around the time that I was praying or talking about a particular subject or person. Then something would happen about it. An example: I had been overdue in calling my stepdad to see how he was doing. I kept reminding myself to call him when I had a moment. Guess what? A few days later my stepdad called me and said he hadn't heard from me in a while and wanted to check to see how I was doing.

So, back to Cynthia and erasers and the cartoon . . . The week prior to this event occurring, I had been praying to find a topic for my next Clarion article for November's issue. I couldn't think of one. After hearing Cynthia's presentation to the young disciples and then seeing this cartoon in the newspaper the very next day, I knew this was not a coincidence. I knew that God was giving me a sign for a topic to write on.

Ever since I stopped believing in coincidences and instead began recognizing them as signs from God, I have felt so much more secure in my life and my faith. To know that God speaks to me so often, whether good or bad, is so comforting. He really is with me all the time. And He is with you, if you will just remember to keep your eyes, ears, and heart open to His "Signs".
