Each Wednesday evening from 6 to 7 PM, about a dozen ladies gather in the Youth Chapel to hear a devotion, read and study scripture, share faith stories, and pray together. We began meeting last September and have met nearly every week during this program year. We have gone from recognizing one another at Sunday worship to becoming sisters in Christ! Between myself, Peg Puryear, and Reneé Wilhelm, we bring the devotional word, each in our own unique way, and the Spirit has been faithful, present, and at work in all of us gals in the circle! When the three of us, along with Kathy Wertman, began to design the study, there were a few things we knew we wanted to incorporate. We wanted the group to meet in the evening so

that those who work outside the home could more easily attend. We wanted to respect the short evening of the woman who just got off work and would be getting up early the next morning to do it all over again, so the study would last one hour, respecting the end time. (Our start time is at 6 PM; however the doors are not locked until 6:10 PM, so the start time has a bit of grace built in!) We also felt that the study should be something that the ladies could drop in on without the fear of missing a week or not having homework done, which becomes more of a challenge for those who work or have children at home. Mostly we just wanted to gather a group of women who could come to where they would hear the word of God and get to wrestle with it. Our discussions are heartfelt and passionate as we share with each other how the scripture has played or plays out in our lives and how the Lord is at work in each one of us. We laugh a lot and cry a little as we open up to each other about our lives.

My favorite night of the week is Wednesday! I look forward to seeing my friends and growing together in Christ with them. And if we are lucky (or good!), Gladys bakes us treats! At the end when we stand together in a circle, hands joined, each saying a name out loud in prayer, and reciting the Lord's Prayer in unison to close, it feels perfect ... it feels like love, and that is why I look forward to attending LIFT each Wednesday night at 6 PM with my 3 B's... Bible, Beverage, and Bifocals!

Our last LIFT of the program year will be May 29 ... feel free to join us any Wednesday between now and then!



Activity at Soul Soup has continued with high numbers attending dinner each Thursday. We are consistently serving 75 or 80 meals a week, including those that are taken out to shut-ins and others who cannot attend.

We are seeing some new faces each week – there seems to be no end to those who are homeless. Our youngest attendee is under a year old and comes with his Mom and Dad. This is a long story that has had a very beneficial turnaround. God seems to be at work even when we think He might not be

in the neighborhood!

It is an absolute blessing to have a facility like KFUMC in which to prepare and serve a meal to our guests and to have a group of volunteers from our church who extend Christ's love to them each week.

Keep us all in your prayers!

Mother — and more

Though I've primarily known God as Father—along with metaphors such as rock, eagle, shepherd, potter—I also learned of Scripture passages portraying God as mother. For example (all NIV):

"For a long time I have kept silent. ... But now, like a woman in childbirth, I cry out, I gasp and pant" (Isaiah 42:14).

"As a mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you" (Isaiah 66:13).

"Like a bear robbed of her cubs, I will attack them" (Hosea 13:8).

In others, God is pictured doing traditional "women's work": making clothes (Genesis 3:21), sweeping (Isaiah 14:23), preparing and hosting a meal (Proverbs 9:1-6), baking bread (Luke 13:21).

One of my favorite images of God is tucked in Hosea. While many modern dads nurture their toddlers this way, the tender words surely call to mind a mama's care: "It was I who taught [Israel] to walk. ... To them I was like one who lifts a little child to the cheek, and I bent down to feed them" (Hosea 11:3-4). Most importantly, God — however known — is loving and good.
