It's Pentecost! Happy birthday Church! Let's wear red to celebrate.

Pentecost is an ancient Jewish Feast Day that celebrates when God gave the Torah to Moses and the Israelites at Mt. Sinai. The holiday is celebrated 50 days after Passover and is the reason the disciples had gathered that day. Jesus had promised that, when two or more are gathered in his name, Jesus would be with them, and wow, was he ever! In Spirit!

While most of the crowd was ready to remember and celebrate the gift of scriptures to the Hebrew people, they were startled by the violent wind that came rushing through, and tongues of fire on the Jesusfollower disciples. "What does this mean?" they asked one another.

It means a lot!

In the church, red is the symbolic color of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is often pictured as a descending white dove, as at Jesus' baptism (Luke 3:21-22 and John 1:32-34) or as red flames of fire (Acts 2:1-41).

Christians co-opted the sacred Jewish holiday of Pentecost to celebrate the birth of the church and the outpouring of the Holy spirit. How appropriate! A day of giving scriptures becomes a day of giving God's Spirit! It was not the first time the Holy Spirit was experienced, nor was it the first-time people gathered as "church." But, what a starting place for the next awesome expression of God through the people God called to walk the path of Jesus.

That's you and me. We are called to walk the path of Jesus, and the Spirit is coming for us to inspire and empower. Let's get ready and celebrate it! Show up, wear red, listen, and go!

Pave The Way

We have launched the "Pave the Way" fundraiser. Now, you will be able to purchase an engraved paver (brick) to be permanently installed in the courtyard of the Kennewick First United Methodist Church. This "buy a brick" campaign will help offset the cost of the church beautification project. This fundraising campaign allows people to purchase a paver to commemorate someone. The buyer can choose to honor themselves, a living family member or friend, or someone who has passed. Each brick will be the same size with the same font (lettering). There will, however, be a few assorted icons that can be added to mark an event such as baptism, membership date, or wedding, etc., for an extra fee. The cost of each 6" by 12" paver will be \$200.00 with an additional fee of \$25.00 for an icon. You may order a Paver through the church office, print it off the church website and mail it in or pick up a form from the information desk on Sunday. You will be able to pay for your

paver with cash, through Pushpay, check or credit card. This campaign is beginning now, to help raise the funds needed to start the front courtyard project. The pavers will be laid in 2026. Please help us get the word out so we can pave the way!
